Daimler Industry Tour



On May 10th, a bright Friday morning, a group of OCDA members and career development professionals toured Daimler Trucks North America to learn about career paths, the worldwide Daimler network of vehicles and services, and of course, all those trucks!



During a discussion with the HR team, we learned about CAReers, the 2-year management training program that takes top talent and introduces them to different Daimler departments and sites. We also learned about careers available at Daimler



for professionals in an array of fields including environmental sciences, biology, engineering fields, business fields, and much more.



And then, it was time for a tour! We saw the lift that dropped 7-ton trucks and crashed them into cement walls, two members of our group bravely rode in a cab for a shaker demonstration during which the cab bounced and rattled as if over cobblestone, speed bumps and other

gauntlet-like road blocks. Later, we viewed the cold chamber, where engineers were testing the cab's

efficiency at keeping the inside warm, part of a multi-million dollar initiative through Daimler and the government.
